Community Consulting Teams | Boston Consulting Project Grant

Since January BPAR has been privileged to work with a talented and extremely knowledgeable team of volunteers who have kindly donated many hours of pro bono management consulting expertise. We've been exploring new forums for educating the public about the mental health impact of adoption and for sharing BPAR resources to encourage lifelong healing. Community Consulting Teams | Boston (CCT) volunteers have designed primary research questionnaires and conducted one-on-one studies with key stakeholders and peers in order to assess the most pressing post adoption educational needs and gaps in resource availability. They are currently analyzing the data. Then CCT will present their final recommendations for the BPAR staff and board to consider.

We can't begin to tell you how privileged we feel to have built this type of relationship with a dedicated, passionate group of volunteer consultants. They are simply amazing. No matter what the future holds in terms of programs derived from this process, our collaboration with CCT has educated *us* in innumerable, lasting ways.


