

Layers of Adoption Trauma

THE BPAR CLINICAL MODEL Love + Education + Connection + Support = Better Outcomes

- Access to adoption-competent mental health services is a strong predictor of positive outcomes for adopted children and their families and the success of their adoption
- Most adoption systems focus on the time of transition – not lifelong needs

IMPACT NUMBERS FY2024

- 6,646 annual individual, family, and group therapy sessions
- 18 therapy groups

170 Massachusetts towns and 30 states reached to date




